AY 2020 Spring Semester APU GLAD Program

1. Overview of the APU GLAD Program

The APU GLAD (Global Learning for sustAinable Development) Program is designed to offer 1st - 2nd semester students (domestic and international) an opportunity to understand global issues as global citizens and search for solutions through online lectures by guest speakers and group work. The focal areas of learning in this program are as follows:

- 1) Learn several frameworks for perceiving the world as a global citizen.
- 2) Learn methods to actualize and make contributions to the world, not limited to words.
- 3) Learn what students must learn about on the university campus and through overseas studies.
- 4) Learn effective communication skills in Japanese and English through online group work.

This program was developed to provide opportunities for multicultural collaborative learning utilizing APU's multicultural, multilingual, multinational campus environment even under circumstances where students cannot physically come to campus. Due to the impact of the novel coronavirus, Off-campus Study Programs have been cancelled for the Spring Semester but we hope that students interested in collaborative learning with other students of diverse backgrounds will participate in this program.

5. Disclaimers and Notices

(1) Program cancellation, change in program content, and revocation of participation

The program may be cancelled or changed as a result of the impact of the novel coronavirus, the accompanying instructions and requests made by the government or local government, other force majeure circumstances or other situations.

Furthermore, this program requires group work and participant's proactive participation in the class. Depending on their attitude and class participation, some participants may have their participation in the program revoked at the discretion of the university if deemed necessary, even after the official announcement of screening results. In this case, in principle, the grade F (fail) will be given.

(2) Withdrawal after acceptance to the program (after the announcement of screening results)

The university conducts the selection process based on the assumption that students intend to participate in the program at the time of their application. If there is a change in the number of participants after the announcement of screening results, it may come impossible to run the program or it may impact other participants and their participation in the course. For these reasons, withdrawal after acceptance to the program will not be permitted.

6. Other

(1) Handling of personal information

Only information necessary for program preparations and procedures will be provided to third parties (APU faculty and staff, guest speakers). The information provided may include your name, student ID, nationality, place of birth, college, age, language and proficiency.

(2) Attitude

Your own attitude and effort will greatly influence whether you will benefit from the program. This requires you to have the flexibility to accept other cultures and to learn proactively. Please determine your own learning goals for participating in the program. Please also make sure to meet deadlines for submitting documents and other assignments.

(3) Course Plan

No special considerations will be made given even if the program schedule coincides with private or curricular courses, make-up classes, examinations, make-up examinations, course registration periods, or language proficiency tests. Please be sure to check the academic calendar, your own schedule and the program schedule in advance.

Be sure to check that subjects taken and the credits earned in the program will not cause problems with your study plan up to graduation. As no special course considerations will be given even if a problem is discovered after acceptance to the program, please take personal responsibility when applying to the program.

(4) Ratio of Domestic and International Students

Please understand that depending on the results of the applications, some groups may consist of only international or domestic students.
