履修の目安 Recommended Qualifications / Knowledge	This course is only open to first-semester APS and APM students who enrolled at APU in the Spring 2019 semester.
授業概要 Course Overview	<p>Students will work to develop the three skills of English (speaking, listening and writing) to a B1 level on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). By the end of this course students will be able to:</p> <p>Speaking: take part in discussions, give short presentations, conduct interviews;</p> <p>Listening: understand the main points in short talks;</p> <p>Writing: write a well-structured argumentative essay;</p> <p>Grammar/Vocabulary: use grammar and vocabulary accurately and appropriately in discussions, presentations, interviews and essays.</p>
到達目標 Course Objectives	<p>By the end of this course, students will be able to do the following in English:</p> <p>1. Listening</p> <p>a. Follow and take notes on an 8–10 minute academic lecture</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - follow the main points of short talks on familiar topics - identify specific information and key details - extract key factual information such as dates, numbers and quantities <p>2. Speaking</p> <p>a. Give a short (3–5 minute) talk about a familiar topic, with visual support</p> <p>b. Participate in a short (5–10 minute) discussion on a familiar topic</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - express belief, opinion, agreement and disagreement politely - explain what they like or dislike about something - briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions, plans and actions - respond to opinions expressed by others - ask basic questions in a simple academic discussion - express opinions as regards possible solutions, giving brief reasons and explanations - ask someone to clarify or elaborate what they have just said <p>c. Carry out a prepared structured interview</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - prepare a simple questionnaire in order to gather data - answer simple questions and respond to simple statements in an interview <p>3. Writing</p> <p>a. Write a simple argumentative essay of 500–650 words</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - write an introduction with a thesis - write body paragraphs with topic sentences and clearly stated reasons supported by evidence - write a conclusion paragraph - demonstrate control of a range of cohesive devices - demonstrate control of a range of A2+/B1 grammatical structures and vocabulary
授業方法 Teaching Methods	<p>A variety of teaching methods will be used in this course, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> · Mini lectures and explanations by instructors. · Teacher-directed reading, listening, speaking, writing, and grammar activities. · Student-directed pair and group work, and grammar and writing assignments.

<p>毎回の授業の概要 Overview of Each Class</p>	<p>The course will be conducted over four weeks with 96 instructional hours and 25+ activity hours for a total of 120 hours. English skills will be developed through the study of the following themes:</p> <p>Quarter 1 Unit 1- Happiness Unit 2- A Time to Learn Unit 3- Sleep</p> <p>Quarter 2 Unit 5- Modern Art Unit 7- Interactive Games Unit 9- Design Thinking</p> <p>Students should see the Course Schedule in Manaba for more details.</p>
<p>予習・復習の内容と分量 Pre-class Study Load [preparation & review]</p>	<p>Students will be required to complete homework tasks and/or preparation assignments/ review tasks of approximately 90 minutes before every class.</p>
<p>成績評価方法 Method of Grade Evaluation</p>	<p>Final grades will be based on the following:</p> <p>Speaking 30% -Interview recording (10%) -Presentation (20%)</p> <p>Listening 20% -Unit listening assessments</p> <p>Vocabulary/Grammar 10% -Unit vocabulary & grammar assessments</p> <p>Writing 40% -Argument essay</p> <p>The APU grading system is as follows: A+ 90% or higher A 80 ~ 89 % B 70 ~ 79 % C 60 ~ 69 % F (Failure) 59 % or lower</p> <p>Participation and Homework Students are expected to participate actively in all class activities and to complete all homework assignments. In this course, students will receive a grade penalty of 0.5% each time their participation falls below the expected standard in class. Participation penalties will be given for the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> not following the teacher's instructions; sleeping in class; not working actively with classmates; using languages other than English; not bringing appropriate materials to class. <p>In terms of homework, students will lose 0.5% for each homework assignment they do not complete. Students can lose up to 10% of their final score for not participating well in class and for not completing homework assignments.</p>

<p>多文化協働学習の実践方法 Method of Implementing Multicultural Cooperative Learning</p>	<p>Students will complete this course abroad at APU's partner university in Singapore. While in Singapore, students will have the opportunity to interview local people and learn about their culture and society. They will also have the opportunity to learn about international education and business by meeting with students and APU alumni in Singapore. In addition, students will work together with classmates to discuss and reflect on the various social, cultural and linguistic differences that they have observed between Japan and Singapore.</p>
<p>学生への要望事項 Requirements for Students</p>	<p>Participation Students are expected to participate actively in all class activities.</p> <p>Attendance Students are expected to attend all classes.</p> <p>Lateness to Class Students who are not present when attendance is taken will be officially recorded as absent.</p> <p>Absence from Class Students who are recorded as absent for 25% or more of classes (including lessons, tests and other examinations) will automatically receive a fail (F) grade. Absences will be excused in some cases, in accordance with the absence policies at the partner university.</p> <p>Responsibility of absent students: Students who are absent from class must contact classmates or their teacher to find out about work done or assigned during their absence.</p> <p>Plagiarism: Students must not copy the work of others, in whole or in part, without use of academic citation. Instructors check student's work for plagiarism carefully, especially with reference to online sources. A student who plagiarizes will receive a mark of zero on the assignment and may possibly fail the course.</p> <p>Test Rules: Students must follow test rules very carefully. If test rules are broken during a test, students will automatically receive a grade of zero for that test and may fail the entire course. Students are also advised to read the APU Student Handbook carefully, especially Section 8 (1), which explains the consequences of cheating on examinations.</p> <p>Language Policy: Students should use English at all times (even during breaks, etc). Students who use other languages may lose participation points.</p> <p>Classroom Policy Students are required to follow the classroom policies of the partner university.</p>
