授業概要 Course Overview	<p>Students will work to develop their reading, vocabulary and test skills to a B1 level on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). By the end of this course students will be able to do the following:</p> <p>Reading: understand a variety of academic texts;</p> <p>Vocabulary: understand vocabulary common to texts in the B1 level of the CEFR scale;</p> <p>Progress Test: understand the test structure and prepare to achieve the target score for IEB on the level 3 Progress test (GSE 35-50).</p>
到達目標 Course Objectives	<p>By the end of this course, students will be able to do the following in English:</p> <p>1. Reading</p> <p>a. Read a variety of texts about familiar topics and some complex or unfamiliar topics.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -identify the main topic and related ideas in a structured text. -recognise examples and their relation to the idea they support. -distinguish between fact and opinion in relation to common topics. -scan a text in order to locate specific information. <p>2. Vocabulary</p> <p>a. Increase vocabulary by at least 160 words.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -understand language related to the textbook topics. -extract the meaning of unknown words from context if the topic is familiar. -review and internalize previously learned vocabulary <p>3. Progress test skills</p> <p>a. Take one of APU's official Progress tests during the semester.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -understand how to implement test-taking skills and strategies needed to achieve high scores on standardized English tests.
授業方法 Teaching Methods	<p>A variety of teaching methods will be used in this course, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> · Mini lectures and explanations by instructors; · Teacher-directed speaking, listening and reading exercises and activities; · Student-directed pair and group work.

<p style="text-align: center;">毎回の授業の概要 Overview of Each Class</p>	<p>The course will be conducted over 2 weeks, with four 95-minute classes per day. English skills will be developed through the study of the following themes:</p> <p>Reading Textbook Units Unit 1- Travel Unit 2- Fire and Water Unit 3- The Power of Ideas Unit 4- Food Unit 5- Natural History Unit 6- Recycling Unit 7- Wildlife Rescue</p> <p>Students should see the Course Overview for more details.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">予習・復習の内容と分量 Pre-class Study Load [preparation & review]</p>	<p>Students will be required to complete homework tasks and/or preparation assignments/ review tasks of approximately 90 minutes every day.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">成績評価方法 Method of Grade Evaluation</p>	<p>Final grades will be based on the following:</p> <p>Reading Assessments 25%</p> <p>Vocabulary Assessments 25%</p> <p>Extensive Reading Assignments 10% -read 50,000 words on Xreading -complete and participate actively in book discussions</p> <p>Homework Assignments 15% -vocabulary online exercises -reading and writing assignments</p> <p>Progress Test 25%</p> <p>Students will be awarded Progress (GSE) points as shown below:</p> <p>i. You will receive 100% for scores of 44+ on the Progress test.</p> <p>ii. You will receive points for Progress scores within the range of 36 to 44 points.</p> <p>NOTE: The Director of English will award points for your best scores from any Progress Test taken during the Spring 2019 semester and any Progress Tests taken during the IEB course in the summer session. Therefore, it is very important that you take all of the tests during the semester and study hard in your English courses.</p> <p>The APU grading system is as follows: A+ 90% or higher A 80 ~ 89 % B 70 ~ 79 % C 60 ~ 69 % F (Failure) 59 % or lower</p> <p>Participation and Homework Students are expected to participate actively in all class activities and to complete all homework assignments. In this course, students will receive a grade penalty of 0.5% each time their participation falls below the expected standard in class. Participation penalties will be given for the following:</p> <p>a) not following the teacher's instructions b) sleeping in class c) not working actively with classmates d) using languages other than English e) not bringing appropriate materials to class</p> <p>In terms of homework, students will lose 0.5% for each homework assignment they do not complete. Students can lose up to 10% of their final score for not participating well in class and for not completing homework assignments.</p>

<p>多文化協働学習の実践方法 Method of Implementing Multicultural Cooperative Learning</p>	<p>1. Students in this course will be exposed to a wide variety of cultural perspectives through topics presented in the textbooks and supplementary materials. 2. Students will have the opportunity to learn about and exchange ideas on different cultural perspectives through pair work and group discussion. 3. Students will use English to learn how to collaborate in groups with people from different cultures and backgrounds to complete a variety of tasks.</p>
<p>学生への要望事項 Requirements for Students</p>	<p>Participation Students are expected to participate actively in all class activities.</p> <p>Attendance Students are expected to attend all classes.</p> <p>Lateness to Class Students who are not present when attendance is taken will be officially recorded as absent.</p> <p>Absence from Class Students who are recorded as absent for 25% or more of classes (including lessons, tests and other examinations) will automatically receive a fail (F) grade. Absences will only be excused in the following cases:</p> <p>a. Contraction of an infectious disease (as recognized by Japanese School Health Law). Students must apply to the APU Academic Office with the required documentation in order to have their absences from English class excused for this reason.</p> <p>b. University–authorized leave of absence. In this case students must apply to the relevant APU office for a leave of absence. The office will then notify teachers directly.</p> <p>Responsibility of absent students: Students who are absent from class must contact classmates or their teacher to find out about work done or assigned during their absence.</p> <p>Students who miss final week assessments must contact their teacher within one week of the date of the assessment, as shown in the course schedule, to request a possible make–up.</p> <p>Plagiarism: Students must not copy the work of others, in whole or in part, without use of academic citation. Instructors check student’ s work for plagiarism carefully, especially with reference to online sources. A student who plagiarizes will receive a mark of zero on the assignment and may possibly fail the course.</p> <p>Test Rules: Students must follow test rules very carefully. If test rules are broken during a test, students will automatically receive a grade of zero for that test and may fail the entire course. Students are also advised to read the APU Student Handbook carefully, especially Section 8 (1), which explains the consequences of cheating on examinations.</p> <p>Language Policy: Students should use English at all times (even during breaks, etc). Students who use other languages may lose participation points.</p> <p>Classroom Policy The following are not permitted in classrooms or computer labs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> · Food and drink; · Private Internet searching and email access; · Mobile phones.
