履修の目安 Recommended Qualifications / Knowledge	This course is open to 2017 curriculum Japanese-basis students (only) in APS and APM, who are studying in the Pre-Intermediate A/B courses in the English Standard Track.
授業概要 Course Overview	This course will be held in conjunction with Pre-Intermediate English A (PIEA) and Pre-Intermediate B (PIEB). Students will work to extend the skills and knowledge learned in their PIEA and PIEB courses and acquire the knowledge and skills needed to study abroad, in preparation for Intermediate English courses to be held at APU and in Singapore during the summer vacation. Students are expected to achieve a level of skill equivalent to A2+ level on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) and a score of at least 39 on the Pearson Global Scale of English (GSE).
	By the end of this course, students will be able to do the following in English: 1. Reading & Writing a. Read with increasing confidence. In particular, you will be able to: - Identify main ideas of short texts. - Skim for general understanding. - Scan for specific information and identify key details. - Recognize definitions and select appropriate words in context.
	 b. Write a comparative paragraph and an advantages and disadvantages paragraph of 220-250 words with a main idea (topic sentence) and a range of supporting sentences that describe similarities and differences and/or the advantages and disadvantages of something. -signal similarity and contrast with a range of language. -write about familiar topics in linked sentences. -write a topic sentence that includes topic and focus, and complex topic sentences with three sub-topics
	2. Speaking & Listening a. Participate actively in a pair discussion on familiar topics for about 10 minutes, sharing ideas and opinions. –express belief, opinion, agreement and disagreement politely. –give an extended description of everyday, familiar topics. –ask relevant questions and respond.

毎回の授業の概要 Overview of Each Class	The course will be conducted over 7 weeks, with eight sets of four 95-minute classes held on Saturdays or Sundays from April to June. Each set of classes will include lessons on Grammar & Vocabulary, Speaking & Listening, Reading & Writing, and Extension activities. English skills will be developed through the study of the following themes related to the content of PIEA and PIEB: •Topic 1 Festivals •Topic 2 The Power of Music •Topic 3: The Internet &Technology •Topic 4: Business •Topic 5: City Life •Topic 6: Small Worlds •Topic 7: Sports The final set of classes will consist of assessments, as exlained below. Students should see the course overview schedule for more details.

学生への要望事項 Requirements for Students	Participation Students are expected to participate actively in all class activities. Students who do not participate satisfactorily may have points deducted from their final scores for the course. Attendance Students are expected to attend all classes. Lateness to Class Students who are not present when attendance is taken will be officially recorded as absent. Absence from Class Students who are recorded as absent for 25% or more of classes (including lessons, tests and other examinations) will automatically receive a fail (F) grade. Absences will only be excused in the following cases: a. Contraction of an infectious disease (as recognized by Japanese School Health Law). Students must apply to the APU Academic Office with the required documentation in order to have their absences from English class excused for this reason. b. University-authorized leave of absence. In this case students must apply to the relevant APU office for a leave of absence. The office will then notify teachers directly. Responsibility of absent students: Students who are absent from class must contact classmates or their teacher to find out about work done or assigned during their absence. Plagiarism: Students must not copy the work of others, in whole or in part, without use of academic citation.
