Teaching Method	<p>[Pre-Activity Class at APU]</p> <p>5th and 6th periods on Wednesday, February 12 and 5th and 6th periods on Thursday, February 13, 2020 (4 lectures in total) Lectures and group works on basic information and theory on International organizations</p> <p>[Field Study]</p> <p>Sunday, February 16~ Thursday, February 27, 2020</p> <p>We will visit UN University, JICA and Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) in Tokyo, UN organizations in Geneva and OECD in Paris, and have interviews to the officials of each organization and stakeholders to understand the objectives and effectiveness of their activities.</p> <p>[Post-Activities Class at APU]</p> <p>Friday, February 28 and Friday, April 3, 2020– 4th- 5th periods (2 lectures in each day, 4 lectures in total.)</p> <p>Sort out information collected through this program and make a presentation on the result of the survey. Based on the result of this program, further study plan will be developed.</p> <p><i>[Environment and Method to implement Multicultural Cooperative Learning]</i></p> <p>In this program, all group works will be done by joint groups of domestic and international students. In addition, by receiving lectures from officials of international organizations who come from variety of countries but work as neutral position to the member countries, students will learn the necessary competencies to work at international organization where the working environment is multicultural.</p>
