**SYLLABUS—LEVEL: 0**

Item	Details
1. Recommended qualification/knowledge	This course is open to APS and APM students who have no experience in Malay/Indonesian language study.
2. Course Objectives	<p>This course emphasizes practical oral and written in bahasa Indonesia through dialogues, listening comprehension exercises, sentence pattern drills, and grammar exercises. The course gives students basic language skills for everyday living, including carrying on simple conversations. Local excursions and field trips reinforce language exercises.</p> <p>After completing this course, students will be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Introduce themselves: name, nationality, job, place of work, address;</li> <li>2. Get information about numbers and simple words used in daily life;</li> <li>3. Ask for prices and bargain at the market;</li> <li>4. Make some simple sentences and communicate with simple conversations;</li> <li>5. Ask and answer about everyday activities;</li> <li>6. Make some Indonesian traditional foods;</li> <li>7. Demonstrate basic understanding of Indonesian cultural interactions;</li> <li>8. Play an Indonesian traditional instrument.</li> </ol>

The course gives students basic language skills for everyday living, including carrying on simple conversations. Introduce themselves: name, nationality, job, workplace, address, families and hobbies;</li><li>2. Ask and answer about everyday activities, language abilities with the grammar that they have learned at STBA LIA;</li><li>3. Make simple sentences and communicate in simple conversations;</li><li>4. Make a phone call using bahasa Indonesia to order Indonesian foods;</li><li>5. Ask for prices and bargain at the market;</li><li>6. Ask about directions;</li><li>7. Make some Indonesian traditional foods;</li><li>8. Demonstrate basic understanding of Indonesian cultural interactions;</li><li>9. Know and understand about some simple Indonesian folklore;</li><li>10. Compare the difference between Indonesian and Japanese (their country) cultures;</li><li>11.
