Recommended qualifications / knowledge	This course is open for students who wish to study Thai, currently taking Thai I or successfully completed the higher-level course.
① Course Objectives	<p>This course aims to further develop Thai language skills from Thai classes in APU, by emphasize on practice in real situations, from both classroom and fieldworks.</p> <p>After completing this course, students should be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Convey individual important information in Thai.</li><li>• Communicate fluently on daily-basis situations.</li><li>• Enhance the skills concerning travelling &amp; working in Thailand.</li><li>• Understand Thai cultural and be able to conduct themselves properly.</li></ul> <p>Language of Instruction at APU: Thai and English</p>
② Standards for Course Completion	<p>Students are required to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Participate actively in class;</li><li>• Complete all assignments on time;</li><li>• Communicate verbally in Thai with the instructor, language partners, and classmates on a variety of topics;</li><li>• Use the learned words and grammar accurately in order to communicate effectively.</li></ul>
③ Teaching Methods	<p>This course use “Linguistic field method”. Students will get the basic knowledge and practice language in classroom with teachers and informants, and study outside of class in real environment of Thai. Students will use the Thai language skills and knowledge that they acquired from classroom to learn more vocabularies or sentences on another events. They have to transcribe/ drawing/ taking a photo and make a short note by themselves.</p>
