Recommended qualifications / knowledge	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• This course is open to APS and APM students.</li><li>• Students who are currently taking Malay/Indonesian ↓ this semester or students who have successfully completed the course.</li></ul>
1. Course Objectives	<p>This course emphasizes practical oral and written bahasa Indonesia through dialogues, listening comprehension exercises, sentence pattern drills, and grammar exercises. The course gives students basic language skills for everyday living, including carrying on simple conversations. Local excursions and field trips reinforce language exercises.</p> <p>After completing this course, students will be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Introduce themselves: name, nationality, job, workplace, address, families and hobbies.</li><li>2. Ask and answer about everyday activities, language abilities with the grammar that they have learned at STBA LIA.</li><li>3. Make simple sentences and communicate in simple conversations;</li><li>4. Make a phone call using bahasa Indonesia to order Indonesian foods;</li><li>5. Ask for prices and bargain at the market;</li><li>6. Ask about directions;</li><li>7. Make some Indonesian traditional foods;</li><li>8. Demonstrate basic understanding of Indonesian cultural interactions;</li><li>9. Know and understand about some Indonesian folklore;</li><li>10. Compare the difference between Indonesian and Japanese (their country) cultures;</li><li>11. Play an Indonesian traditional instrument.</li></ol>
2. Standards for Course Completion	<p>Students must:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Participate actively in class, homestay program and field trip program;</li><li>2. Complete all assignments on time;</li><li>3. Communicate verbally in bahasa Indonesia with the instructor and classmates on a variety of topics;</li><li>4. Use the learned words and grammar accurately in order to communicate effectively;</li><li>5. Make friends with language partners and other Indonesian students;</li></ol>

<p>3. Teaching Method</p>	<p>This course emphasizes practical oral and written bahasa Indonesia by using communicative methods. Students practice dialogues, listening comprehension exercises, sentence pattern drills, and grammar exercises. Some language partners will help students to practise conversations together.</p>

On Thursdays there will be 3 periods. One class period is 100 minutes.</li> <li>• Classes are from 09.20– 11.00 and 11:10 – 12.50 with 10-minute break and the third period will be from 14.00-15.40.</li> <li>• Students are also strongly encouraged to practice with their Indonesian language partners while participating in daily life in Jakarta.</li> <li>• Study tour: In addition, study tour will be conducted 4 times on February 21<sup>st</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup>, March 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>.</li> <li>• Homestay program will be on March 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>.</li> </ul> <p><b>[Post program class]</b></p>

5. Method of Grade Evaluation	<p>Grading system: A + , A, B, C / F</p> <p>Students are evaluated on the following criterion:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Pre-lectures: Attendance, performance, assignments 20%</li> <li>2. Evaluation from STBA LIA Jakarta: 60%. The content of bahasa Indonesia final examination includes four parts: listening, writing, speaking and vocabulary - grammar. It will be conducted by STBA LIA Jakarta in the end of the language course.</li> <li>3. Post-lecture: Attendance, group presentation, assignments 20%</li> </ol> <p>Credits: 2 (Counted as credits for the Fall 2013 semester.)</p>
4. Requirement for Students	<p>Participation: Students are expected to participate actively in all class activities.</p> <p>Attendance: Students are expected to attend all classes.</p> <p>Plagiarism: Students must not copy the work of others, in whole or in part, without use of academic citation. Instructors check student's work for plagiarism carefully, especially with reference to online sources. A student who plagiarizes will receive a mark of zero on the assignment and may possibly fail the course.</p> <p>Classroom Policy: The following are not permitted in the classroom:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1.
