Meet the Lecturer



Dr. John (Jack) CONDON

John Condon is Regents' Professor Emeritus in the Dept. of Communication & Journalism, University of New Mexico. Regarded as a founder of the field of intercultural communication and an award winning educator and author, Dr. Condon helped shape the field while at Northwestern University, International Christian University (ICU), the University of New Mexico, and as guest professor at universities in Latin America and East Africa. As guest professor at APU Condon credits his time here as "among the most stimulating engagements with students in my 60 years of teaching."



Dr. Condon is the author of several books, including the first textbook in the field, and books on Japanese-US and Mexican-US communication. His latest book, It Goes Without Saying, about his friend, anthropologist E.T. Hall who coined the term "intercultural communication," will be published in 2020. A retrospective about Prof. Condon, "A different Way of knowing: with respect to John C (Jack) Condon," appeared in the International Journal of Intercultural Communication in 2017.

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
