2018 Fall ANDO Momofuku Honor Prize

For Undergraduate Students Graduating in 2019 Spring

The ANDO Momofuku Honor Prize is the most prestigious honor awarded to an undergraduate student enrolled at APU.

The recipient of this prize has the honor of giving a speech at the graduation ceremony as a representative of the graduating class, and is expected to go on to represent APU as the recipient goes on to become international leader. The recipient also receives a monetary award in the form of one million yen from an endowment by the late Dr. ANDO Momofuku.

I. Purpose Application Guidelines

The ANDO Momofuku Honor Prize was established through a generous endowment by the late Dr. ANDO Momofuku, founder of NISSIN FOODS HOLDINGS Co., Ltd. and the recipient of an honorary doctorate from Ritsumeikan University. This prize is intended to support and encourage students who are expected to go on to become leaders in the Asia Pacific region.

II. Overview

- 1. The recipient receives a certificate and a cash award of one million yen. (The prize will be awarded after the selected candidate passes their graduation assessment and makes a scheduled visit to the headquarters of NISSIN FOODS HOLDINGS Co., Ltd.)
- 2. Number of awardees: 1

III. Application Eligibility

Applicants must meet all of the following conditions to be eligible for the Honor Prize.

- Expected to graduate in March 2019. A selected candidate who fails to graduate as scheduled will have their prize revoked.
- 2. Students who have an understanding of this scholarship's objective and meaning; who have high ambitions for their future career; have good records in both academic and extracurricular activities at APU; and have the potential to realize their ambitions.
- 3. Students who have obtained outstanding achievements in the field of academics or have displayed outstanding performance in extracurricular and independent activities.
- 4. Completed a periodic health checkup.
- 5. Is able to participate in a visit to NISSIN FOODS HOLDINGS Co., Ltd. sometime between January and March 2019.
- 6. Has not been subject to disciplinary action.

IV. Evaluation Criteria

During both the first and second screenings, applicants will be evaluated using the criteria below to determine if they fulfill the purpose of the Honor Prize.

8. Originality and creativity; both traits that Dr. ANDO Momofuku emphasized greatly.

Additional Criteria

9. Shows that they understand and feel a resonance with the late Dr. ANDO Momofuku and Nissin Foods Holdings Co. Ltd.

1. First Screening

2) First screening results announced

Results will be announced Thursday November 15, 2018 by personal message on Campus Terminal.

2. Second Screening

Only applicants who successfully passed the first screening are included in the second screening.

1) Second Screening Guidance Session

Candidates will be provided advice on and information about preparing for the presentation and interview, including how to prepare their presentations and what to include in their summary.

Date and Time: Friday, November 16, 16:30-17:00

Location: To be announced.

Applicable students: Candidates who passed the first screening.

2) Time, Date, and Location for second screening

Date: Wednesday, December 12

Time: Candidates will gather at 17:15, and the second screening is tentatively scheduled to finish at 20:00. Candidates are asked to clear their schedule throughout the day of the interview.

Location: To be announced.

Languages: Presentations and interviews will use both English and Japanese.

Format: Presentation and interview open to the public. Please note that entry to the room will be limited during each candidate's screening.

3) Presentation and Interview

Presentation

Theme: "Why I am the most qualified candidate to receive the ANDO Momofuku Honor Prize" Candidates must prepare a ten minute presentation with a title in line with the theme above.

Note:

- (1) Presentations must not exceed the allotted time.
- (2) One minute of your presentation must be self-introduction in your non-basis language, with the remaining nine minutes in your basis language.

Interview

After their presentation, candidates will stand for an eighteen minute interview. Interview topics may include: The content of their presentation, content from their first screening application, NISSIN FOODS HOLDINGS Co., Ltd., Dr. ANDO Momofuku, or other subjects.

Note:

(1) Five minutes of the interview will be conducted in the candidate's non-basis language. The other 13 minutes of the interview will be conducted in the candidate's basis language.

Personal Introduction (optional)

Prior to a candidate's presentation, a friend or associate of the candidate may give a speech of up to one minute in length to introduce the candidate. This is optional and will have no effect on the evaluation of the candidate.

4) Second screening results announced

Results from the second screening will be announced Friday, December 21, 2018 via personal message on Campus Terminal.

In the case that there is a close runner-up, a President's Prize in the amount of 100,000 yen may be established and awarded at the graduation ceremony.

3. Schedule for Prize Recipient

- •Wednesday, January 9, 2019: Ceremony *The recipient will be asked to make a speech.
- •Friday, March 15, 2019: Honor Prize awarded to the recipient at graduation ceremony *The recipient will be asked to make a speech.
- •Around January-March 2019: Visit to NISSIN FOODS HOLDINGS Co., Ltd. (*Required)

VII. Other


- 1. Applications containing false information or candidates deemed unfit to receive the Honor Prize will be revoked

Dr. ANDO Momofuku

In 1958, Dr. ANDO Momofuku invented the world's first instant noodles in the form of Chicken Ramen. A food ready to eat in just two minutes after adding hot water, Chicken Ramen was dubbed "magic ramen," and immediately went on to become an immense hit product.

Furthermore, in 1971, Dr. ANDO invented the world's first noodle-in-a-cup product with Cup Noodles, the culmination of varied wisdom and innovative ideas. The birth of this product prompted instant noodles, which had originated in Japan, to become a global food.

In 2005, Dr. ANDO contributed to the diet of mankind even in space by developing Space Ram, the world's first instant noodles to be consumed in space, at the age of 94. He would continue to possess creative ideas and the tenacity to persevere until the close of his life at the age of 96.

Dr. ANDO graduated from Ritsumeikan University in 1934, and was subsequently conferred the title of Honorary Doctor of that University in 1996.
