

## 1. Assessment for Continuation for the Tuition Reduction Plan and Special Scholarship for International Students

Assessment for continuation is conducted each semester during a student's period of study, with decisions of "continue", "warning", or "revocation" made based on the student's academic record.

The same assessment standards are applied to students receiving the Tuition Reduction Scholarship (100%, 80%, 65%, 50%, or 30% reduction) and the Special Scholarship for International Students.

### (1) Warning

You will receive your first "warning" if your grades in the current semester apply to either or both 1 and 2. You will receive your second "warning" if your grades in the next semester apply to either or both 1 and 2.

#### 1) For students who have obtained the following number of credits (see below):

	Enrollees in 2011 or after
On completion of 1 <sup>st</sup> semester	12 credits or less *1
On completion of 2 <sup>nd</sup> semester	26 credits or less
On completion of 3 <sup>rd</sup> semester	40 credits or less
On completion of 4 <sup>th</sup> semester	54 credits or less
On completion of 5 <sup>th</sup> semester	66 credits or less
On completion of 6 <sup>th</sup> semester	80 credits or less
On completion of 7 <sup>th</sup> semester	98 credits or less *2

\*1 Credits obtained for your first semester

Since you can only take up to 18 credits for your second semester, you must obtain at least 10 credits in your first semester to avoid receiving two consecutive warnings.

\*2 Students who enrolled in 2011 or after can register for up to 24 credits in their 8<sup>th</sup> semester.

#### 2) Students with an unusually low semester grade point average **(GPA of 1.5 or less)**

Please refer to the Undergraduate Academic Handbook for the method used to calculate semester GPA.

### (2) Revocation

Students who receive **two consecutive warnings** will have their scholarships revoked for the semester in which they are notified. Once scholarships are revoked, they can not be reinstated.

If a student has only obtained less than or equal to 98 credits (see above) by the end of their seventh semester, their scholarship will be revoked on the first warning.

Example:

A student received a warning in the 2017 spring semester due to poor academic performance in their 2016 fall semester. The student's poor record continued in the 2017 spring semester so a second warning was issued in the 2017 fall semester and his/her scholarship was revoked from the 2017 fall semester.
