Campuses

The below University of Newcastle campuses are available for exchange students to study at.

Callaghan campus: this is our main campus, where the majority of courses are offered, and where our on-campus accommodation is located.

City campuses: our city campuses are located a 20 min bus ride from the Callaghan campus. Students can catch the free shuttle bus and walk to Nuspace from there. Q Building is an additional 5- minute walk away.

Ourimbah campus: this campus is located an hour away from Newcastle. We do not recommend that students take courses offered at Ourimbah.

Accommoda tion

On-Campus Housing

Students wishing to apply for on campus accommodation are encouraged to apply for accommodation as soon as possible, regardless if they have received a letter of Offer into the Study Abroad or Exchange Program. A full time study load at The University of Newcastle is 30-40 units per semester.

Students are able to take courses from across different disciplines, please note health courses may be restricted for exchange students.

Campuses: students can take courses from across Callaghan and City campuses, there is a free shuttle bus between them.

Course Levels: 1000 level courses are typically taken in 1st year, 2000 level in 2nd year etc. 5000 and 6000 level courses are postgraduate courses.

Restricted Courses: Many courses in the handbook will have 'EP' in front of the course code, e.g. EPHUMA1000. These courses are not available to Exchange or Study Abroad students. Some health courses are also restricted for exchange students.

Postgraduate Courses: Some Postgraduate courses (particularly Business) are offered in trimesters. Trimester dates can be found HERE

Application Deadlines

Deadlines are flexible for partners.

Entry Requiremen ts

Undergraduate admissions: Students are required to have a minimum GPA of 2.0/4.0 or equivalent. Students should have completed at least one year of full time study at a university or other institution of higher education.

Postgraduate Admissions: Students are required to have a completed bachelor degree in a relevant discipline.

Gap year Admissions: Students are required to submit a completed high school transcript to be assessed on a case by case basis.

English Language Requiremen ts

Exchange and Study Abroad Students are required to meet the Universities English Language Proficiency Policy.

Some English language proficiency test score requirements can be found in the table below. Further accepted qualifications and test results can be found in the <u>Procedure</u>.

Alternate ways to prove English requirements:

- Proof of Successful completion of a minimum 1 year full time equivalent study at AQF7 or above wholly conducted and assessed in English at a recognised institution. – please email study-abroad@newcastle.edu.au for a letter template.

Application Instructions

You will need to upload certified copies of the following in the Application form:

- An official transcript of your current student record
- Evidence of English proficiency as per English Proficiency Policy
- Copy of your passport

Exchange students need to have been nominated by their home institution prior to submitting this form

Overseas Health Cover (OSHC)

It is a condition of your student visa to have <u>OSHC</u> for the duration of your student visa. Some countries may be <u>exempt</u>. Please note that travel insurance and your university insurance *is not the same as OSHC*.

The University of Newcastle can arrange OSHC for you if you tick yes on your application form. UON has a preferred agreement with Medibank which will cost approximately \$430 - \$480 for a semester. The exact cost will be listed on your offer letter.

If you wish to purchase your own OSHC, it needs to be issued by an approved <u>Australian provider</u> as per Australian Government Regulations.

Accepting Your Offer

Once you have received your offer letter, please complete the following;

- **1.**Review your offer letter to ensure that your offer details and fees are correct. If you believe any information is incorrect, please contact ia@newcastle.edu.au. If your offer is "conditional," you will need to provide extra documents, please read your offer letter carefully and submit these as soon as possible.
- **2.** If you submitted courses in your application, the approved ones will be listed in your offer letter, please check which courses you were approved for.

- **3**. Your offer letter will state any deposit you need to pay. This amount will need to be paid in order for you to receive your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE).
- **4.** Please complete and sign Section 6 and 7, and upload a copy of your signed acceptance to the Access Portal. If you are organising your own Overseas Health Cover, please upload a copy of your policy certificate as well.

If you are having difficulties meeting the conditions of your offer, please contact ia@newcastle.edu.au to discuss your options.

Once you have accepted your offer and provided the necessary documents and payment, you will be issued with a CoE.

Applying for your VISA

In order to apply for a Student Visa you will need a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) as well as proof of your OSHC. **Students should not apply for a Visa until they have these 2 documents.**
