A. What Are Seminar Courses?

1) Overview

Seminar Courses are **NOT Required Courses**, but...

[3rd year seminars]

In 3rd year seminars, small numbers of students work closely with professors to increase their expertise through researching, presenting and discussing selected topics. Simultaneously, through actual practice, students master the research methods and investigative analysis techniques considered necessary for every area of study and which are the fundamental skills required for undergraduate research.

[4th year seminars]

4th year seminars are the culmination of a students' four years of study at APU. These highly specialized subjects allow students to research a topic of interest and write a thesis or produce the required research output over a period of one year.

2) Term and Credit



(1) Seminar Courses consist of four courses.

(2) Each course lasts 1 semester for a total of 2 years' study.

*Please note that, as a rule, the subjects for the 4th year students, Research Seminar/Graduation Thesis I and Undergraduate Thesis/Graduation Thesis II are packaged as a 1-year course.

(3) Students can earn a maximum of 10 credits. (14 Credits if you have taken *sub-seminars within the same college during your 3rd year.)

3) Main Seminar



- (1) *3rd year students* may take two 3rd year seminars; One as your main seminar, and the other as your sub-seminar.
4th year students may only take a main seminar.**
- (2) There are three types of seminars: seminars offered by the student's enrolled college, seminars by both colleges (APS and APM), and seminars by the other college. The seminars offered by both colleges are treated in the same way as the seminars by their enrolled college.**
- (3) Main seminars can be taken only in seminars offered by your enrolled college or seminars by both colleges.**
- (4) Main seminars will be automatically registered until you reach UT/GR-II. However, if you receive an "F" in RS/GR-I in the 7th semester, you will not be automatically registered for UT/GR-II (you cannot take it).**

***In the case of the 3rd year seminar, even if the grade is "F", the student will be automatically registered in the next semester.**

3) Sub-Seminar (**Changes from spring 22: yellow highlights**)

(1) Sub-seminars can be taken only in the 3rd year seminar (Major Seminar).

Criteria to take a sub-seminar *all of the following must be met.

- 1) Your application has been approved by the sub-seminar instructor.
- 2) The timetables for the both seminars do not overlap. In case of overlapping, your sub-seminar course will be deleted.

(2) Sub-seminars **will be automatically registered for up to 6 semester.**

(3) For your sub-seminar, you can apply for a seminar from the other college. **If you want to take a seminar of the other college as a sub seminar, you can take only the sub seminar.** The earned credits will be counted in your **general electives/other college.**

(4) If you are enrolled in both main/sub seminars and cancel the main

B) Application / Cancellation Rules



1) General Rules (Changes from spring 22: yellow highlights)

- (1) Students are required to apply one semester before they intend to take seminar courses.
- (2) Once you have been registered, you will automatically be registered for a seminar course each semester until you reach Undergraduate Thesis (UT)/Graduation Research II (GR-II). ※2 years of continuous registration is recommended.
- (3) In order to cancel taking a seminar, **you need to cancel during Course Registration Period (until Correction Period I) on Campusmate by yourself.**

Note ★ When your supervisor will be on their sabbatical leave, maternity leave, retiring, etc., it is requested to cancel your seminar and apply for a new one if you wish.

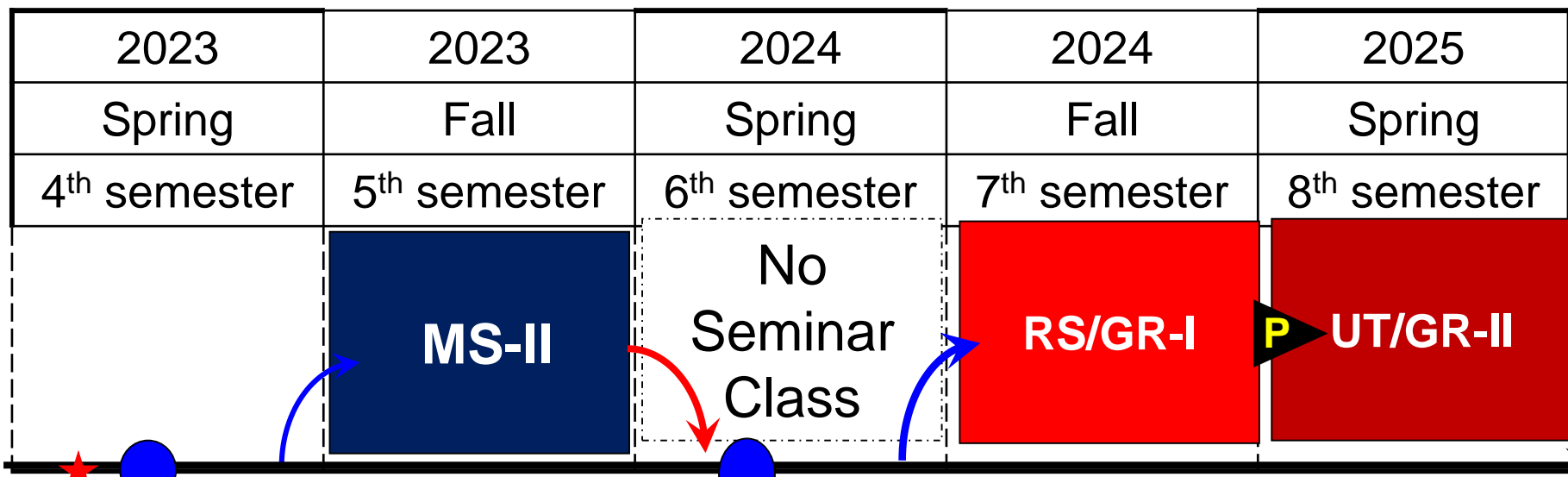

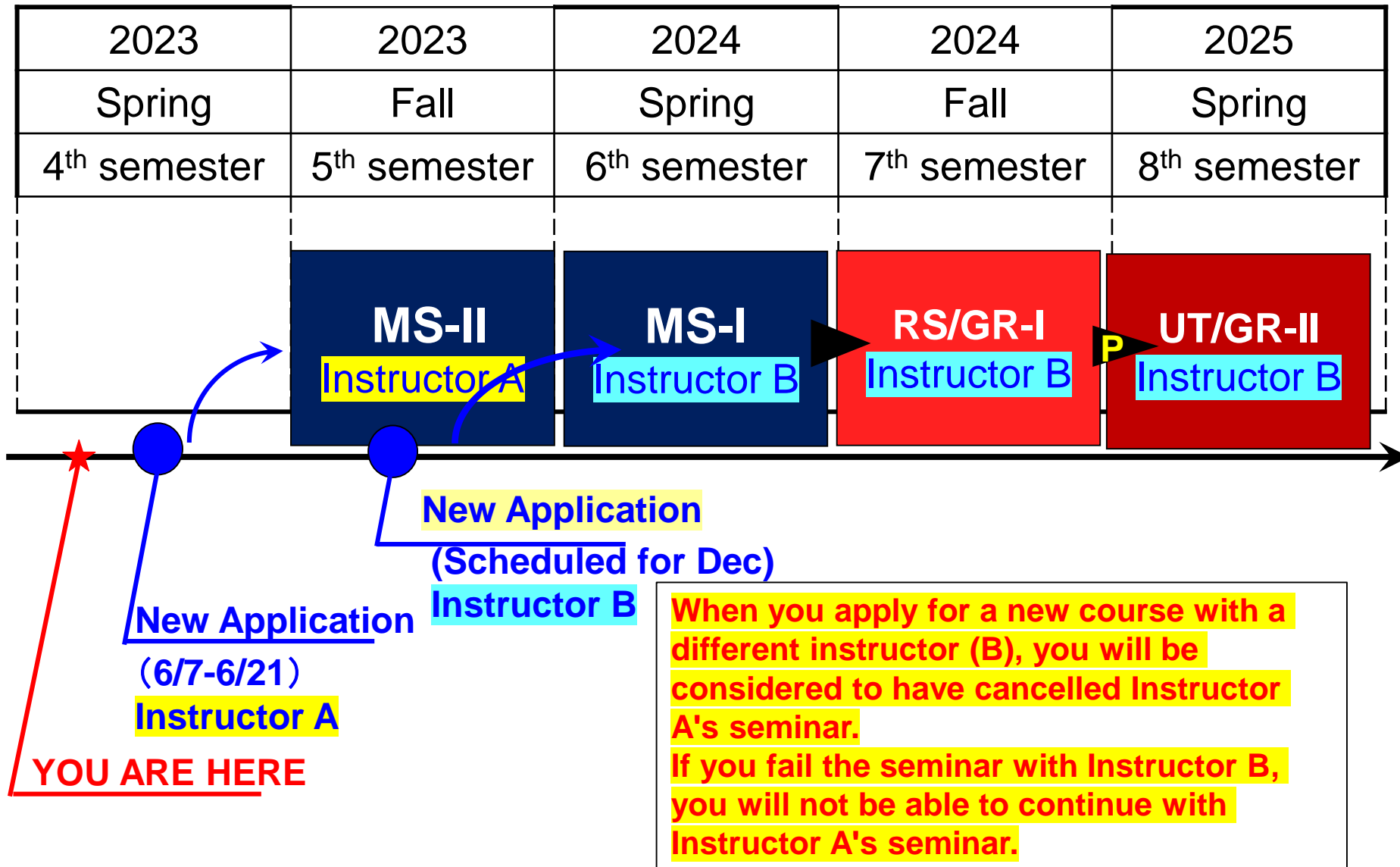

Note that credits earned from Seminar Subjects, regardless which area of study it falls under, will be tallied in all areas of study. (~~✕~~Does not apply to AY2011 APS Students)

E. Application Procedure & Other Important Information to Note

1) 1st Choice and 2nd Choices for Main Seminar



- Applications can be made via RISING FDC.
- Application for main seminar
You can apply to two seminars, one for your first choice and one for your second choice.
- Application for sub-seminars (3rd year seminar only)
Only one application can be made. The application procedure and period are the same as for the main seminar. **Application only for sub-seminars is possible only if the sub-seminar is a seminar of the other college.**
- If you pass only the sub seminar
The sub-seminar is that of your college; it will be changed to a main.
The sub-seminar is that of the other college; it will be taken as a sub.

Please note that **having a consultation with your preferred instructor(s) are required in advance of application.**

4) Timetable

Be sure to check the timetable with your supervisor before registration period A to avoid conflict between classes. It is highly recommended you have completed your language courses as there is some possibility that their timetables should overlap. (in such cases, seminar courses cannot be registered.)

There have been actual cases in which students failed to confirm the timetable of the 4th year seminar class before the semester begins and later discovered that the seminar class overlapped with another one.

5) Seminar Application Essay & Assignment



- As a standard requirement for both main seminar and sub-seminar applications, applicants are asked to provide an essay stating the reason why they wish to apply for the seminar and so on. You are free to write your essay however you wish in approximately 600 words (about 1 A4 size sheet of paper in length)
- In addition to the essay, some instructors may require a supplementary assignment so please be sure to check the syllabus way in advance or ask your seminar instructors directly during individual consultations.
- There are cases in which applicants are exempted from providing an essay. Please see the next slide for more details.
- As you are to enter the essay and/or assignment directly into the application page in RISING FDC, we strongly recommend that you prepare your essay/assignment beforehand using MS word(or any equivalent word processing software).
- The box provided in RISING FDC only accepts plain text. Assignments which require the use of objects (images, tables, graphs, etc.) may be uploaded as a separate file using the upload feature found right below the text box for the assignment. (up to 20mb)

- Patterns of applying for sub-seminars only

- If you have not taken the main seminar, you can apply for a new sub-seminar only if you are applying for a sub-seminar in the other college.

- In the case you pass only the sub-seminar
If the sub-seminar is a seminar of your college, it will be taken as a main seminar.
If the sub-seminar is a seminar of the other college, it will be taken as a sub-seminar.
