Course Overview	卒業研究IIでは、学生それぞれが卒業研究Iで進めてきた研究を卒業論文にまとめあげる。それは大学4年間の学びのすべてが統合された集大成ともなる。 卒業論文または卒業レポートを作成することで、学生は研究対象をより深く研究分析・考察する能力を身につけるとともに、卒業論文または卒業レポートによってより適切に表現する能力を身につける。つまり、学部生として研究課題(テーマとリサーチ・クェスチョン等)を適切に設定する能力、情報収集する能力、分析・考察する能力を身につけることが期待される。 なお卒業論文とは以下である. APSにおける研究・学習の集大成となるのが卒業論文である。 卒業論文の作成にあたっては、APSにおいて学んできた知識を踏まえて各自のテーマを設定し、そのテーマに沿った執筆計画の立案と、その自発的かつ積極的な遂行、そして卒業論文を完成させることが本講義の目標となる。 卒業論文は、一定の審査基準による審査を通じて、卒業のために身につけておくべき能力(選択したテーマについての十分な知識の獲得、問題設定から結論にいたるまでの緻密で厳密な論理展開をおこなう能力、文章や口頭で自己の議論を明確に説明する能力等)が習得されているかを判断する。
	In the required course Graduation Research II, students each compile the research they have been working on in Graduation Research I into a graduation thesis. This serves as the culmination, where all the learning from the four years of university is integrated. Through the creation of a graduation thesis or report, students develop the ability to conduct in-depth research, analysis, and examination of their research topics. Additionally, they acquire the skills to express their findings more effectively through the graduation thesis or report. In other words, as undergraduate students, they are expected to develop the ability to appropriately define research topics (themes and research questions), gather information, analyze and examine, and effectively express their research findings.
	Furthermore, a graduation thesis or report is defined as follows: The culmination of research and learning in APS is the graduation thesis. When creating a graduation thesis, the goal of this course is for students to establish their own topics based on the knowledge they have gained at APS, develop a writing plan in line with that theme, and complete the thesis through self-driven and proactive efforts. The graduation thesis undergoes evaluation based on specific criteria to assess whether students have acquired essential skills required for graduation. These skills include obtaining sufficient knowledge in their

	chosen topic, demonstrating the ability to engage in rigorous and logical argumentation from problem formulation to conclusion, and effectively presenting their arguments both in writing and verbally.
Course Objectives	学生は、少人数クラスでの指導をもとに、卒業論文、卒業レポートを作成することができる。それにより、学生は研究対象をより深く研究分析・考察する能力を身につけるとともに、卒業論文または卒業レポートによってより適切に表現する能力を身につける。つまり、学部生として研究課題(テーマとリサーチ・クエスチョン等)を適切に設定する能力、情報収集する能力、分析・考察する能力と、研究成果を適切に表現する能力を身につけることができる。 Students have the opportunity to create their graduation theses or reports with guidance in small-class settings. This enables students to develop a deeper understanding of their research topics, enhance their analytical and evaluative skills, and improve their ability to articulate their findings effectively through their graduation thesis or report. In essence, as undergraduate students, they have the opportunity to cultivate the skills necessary for setting appropriate research topics (themes and research questions), gathering information, conducting analysis and examination, and proficiently articulating their research outcomes.
