• If you have attended school in a country or region specified in (1) for the language you wish to study, even if you are not a native speaker of the language, you must consult with the course instructor before registering for the course.

→ If you either

A) have attended school in a country or region specified in (1) for the language you wish to study, even if you are not a native speaker of the language, or

B) your nationality is one of the countries or regions shown in (1), you must consult with the course instructor before registering for the course.

• If you have attended school in a country, region, or at an institution specified in (2), even if the language you wish to study is not your native, official, or a common language in your area, you must consult with the course instructor before registering for the course.

→ If you have either

A) attended school in a country, region, or institution specified in (2), even if the language you wish to study is not your native, official, or common language, or

B) your nationality matches a country or region specified in (1), you must consult with the course instructor before registering for the course.

• If your country/nationality is shown in (1) or (2) below and you register for a course without consulting with the course instructor in advance, the Academic Office will delete your course registration.
