## Other Functions



Function	Description	Function	Description
Wordcloud	Simple text mining function. It shows words entered by students, and more common words are shown larger and in color. Ref: Moodle.org	External Tool	A function for connecting to LTI-compliant Learning resources. APU Moodle is already connected to Zoom and Panopto, so you do not need to use this function.
Glossary	The glossary is a list of words and their definitions. Normally, instructors set up glossaries for their students, but Moodle's glossary is not one-way only – students can also edit or add words to the glossary.  Ref: Moodle Docs (External Link)	Lesson	This function allows you to set up multiple branching exercise pages.  Ref: Moodle Docs (External Link)
Database	You can work together with students to collect information on set topics. When creating a database, the instructor must first create a database template, then students can enter the required information.  Ref: Moodle Docs (External Link)	Custom Certificate	You can generate fully customized dynamic PDF certificates through your browser.  Ref: Moodle Docs (External Link)
Wiki	A tool that allows multiple participants to create one article. You can use this for group study. Moodle has two types of wikis – "Joint Wiki" and "Individual Wiki." In individual wikis, one participant works to create one article. In joint wikis, all participants or selected groups can work on one article.  Ref: Moodle Docs (External Link)	Survey	A function for responding to preset surveys in Moodle in set formats (validated survey methods such as COLLES (Constructivist Online Learning Environment Survey) and ATTLS (Attitudes to Thinking and Learning Survey)).
