Recommended qualifications/ knowledge	<p>[Vietnamese I]</p> <p>This course is open to APS and APM students who have no basic in Vietnamese.</p> <p>This course is equivalent to Vietnamese Level 1 (Beginning).</p> <p>After completing the course, students will receive 2 credits for Intensive Language Learning Overseas (Language Education Subject).</p> <p>[Vietnamese II]</p> <p>This course is open to APS and APM students who studied Vietnamese Level 1 at APU.</p> <p>This course is equivalent to Vietnamese Level 2 (Elementary).</p> <p>After completing the course, students will receive 2 credits for Intensive Language Learning Overseas (Language Education Subject).</p> <p>[Vietnamese III]</p> <p>This course is open to APS and APM students who studied Vietnamese Level 2 at APU.</p> <p>This course is equivalent to Vietnamese Level 3 (Intermediate).</p> <p>After completing the course, students will receive 2 credits for Intensive Language Learning Overseas (Language Education Subject).</p>

① Course Objectives

This course emphasizes practical oral and written Vietnamese language through dialogues, listening comprehension exercises, sentence pattern drills, and grammar exercises. The course gives students basic language skills for everyday living, including carrying on simple conversations. After completing this course, students will be able to:

[Vietnamese I]

- Introduce themselves: name, nationality, job, place of work, address;
- Ask and answer about everyday activities, language abilities
- Get information about time and date;
- Get simply instructed about train and bus schedule, course time-table;
- Ask for prices and bargain at the market;
- Converse simply about family status and family members;
- Demonstrate basic understanding of Vietnamese cultural interactions.

[Vietnamese II]

- Buy air and train tickets and ask information on trips and flights, means of transportation, ticket, flight arrangement, travel time, tourism spot, tourism option;
- Interact in coffee shop and restaurants to order foods and drinks, name of Vietnamese special foods and drinks, restaurant ordering, customer's compliment or complain;
- Give and receive details on location and direction such as address, map, situation of getting lost, orientation description;
- Converse about family relationship terms, marriage status, family condition;
- Demonstrate basic understanding of Vietnamese cultural interactions;
- Read and write texts of 200-300 words on popular topics;
- Speaking Vietnamese language naturally and accurately on popular topics;
- Demonstrate understanding of Vietnamese cultural interactions.

[Vietnamese III]

- Interact confidently in stores and shops;
- Talk about health status and talk with a doctor;
- Talk on telephone and leave a phone message;
- Talk about travel plans or report a journey;
- Make hotel reservations;
- Communicate plans and intentions;
- Read and write texts of 200-300 words on popular topics;
- Speaking Vietnamese language naturally and accurately on popular topics;
- Demonstrate understanding of Vietnamese cultural interactions.

<p>④ Overview of Each Class</p>	<p>[Active Learning Participants Guidance]</p> <p>Wed., May 19; 5th period: Recruit Guidance Session</p> <p>Wed., July 28; 5th period: Preliminary Lecture (1)</p> <p>Wed., August 4; 5th period: Preliminary Lecture (2)</p> <p>[Online program]</p> <p>Mon., August 09 – Fri., September 3, 2021 (revised)</p> <p>The program will be conducted in 4 weeks, only on weekdays.</p> <p>Vietnamese Language course: total instructions hours will be 60. Students are also strongly encouraged to practice with their Vietnamese language partner in cultural and language exchange (online) with Ton Duc Thang University students.</p> <p>[Post program class]</p> <p>Wed., September 8; 5th period.</p> <p>* When you can't attend the Pre or Post program classes, please make sure to notify the faculty of your program in advance.</p>

⑤ Method of Grade Evaluation	<p>Grading system: A+, A, B, C / F</p> <p>Students are evaluated on the following criterion:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pre lectures: Performance, assignments 10% • Evaluation from Ton Duc Thang University: 80%. <p>The content of Vietnamese language final examination includes four parts: listening, writing, speaking and vocabulary-grammar. It will be conducted by Ton Duc Thang University in the end of the language course.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Post lecture: Presentation, assignments 10%
⑥ Requirements for Students	<p><u>Participation:</u> Students are expected to participate actively in all class activities.</p> <p><u>Attendance:</u> Students are expected to attend all classes.</p> <p><u>Plagiarism:</u> Students must not copy the work of others, in whole or in part, without use of academic citation. Instructors check student's work for plagiarism carefully, especially with reference to online sources. A student who plagiarizes will receive a mark of zero on the assignment and may possibly fail the course.</p>
