Partial Changes to Class Formats from April 26

To all students,

In the 2021 Spring Semester, classes opened under the format of students with IDs ending in odd numbers attending classes in person during Week 1, and students with IDs ending in even numbers attending classes in person during Week 2.

Based on in-person attendance in Week 1 and 2, <u>students who would like to attend classes in</u> person will be able to from Week 3 (April 26) onwards, excluding some courses.

(1) Hybrid-style Courses

- In principle, all students in all Hybrid-style courses will be permitted to attend classes on campus.
 Students can attend classes on campus regardless of whether their Student ID number is even or odd.
- However, if all students in the courses shown below come to campus for class, it is likely that the
 seating capacity of classrooms will be exceeded, so students will continue to take classes weekby-week based on whether their ID number is even or odd. (Students taking the following courses
 will continue to alternate taking these courses in person and online each week. If students need to
 take their online class while on campus, they should take it from an Open Classroom.)

(3) Online Courses / On-Campus Courses

· These courses will continue to be held unchanged.

(4) Notes on taking classes in person

- Please continue to prevent the spread of infection by wearing a mask, disinfecting your hands, sitting in designated seats, and avoiding the 3 C's (closed spaces, crowded places, and closecontact settings).
- Please take your temperature every morning, and do not take classes in person if you have a fever over 37.5°C or feel ill.
- If you feel ill and are unable to take classes in person, please join online from your home for hybrid classes. For in-person classes, please contact the instructor to inform them that you feel ill and follow the instructions.
- When using facilities such as the cafeteria, please keep conversation to a minimum while eating and drinking, and please wear a mask while talking.
- When commuting to school by bus, please wear a mask while riding and keep conversation to a minimum inside the bus.
- Depending on the infection status of the novel coronavirus, classes held in-person may be changed to online.
