1. Cumulative GPA and Semester GPA

What is GPA?

A student grade valuation method that uses the grades from each course, calculated using APU's GPA formula

Cumulative GPA:

Calculated using all grades from Enrollment to current semester

Used for: Transcripts, Exchange Programs, Accelerated Graduation, Course Registration, etc.

Semester GPA:

Calculated using all grades from that semester only

Used for: Scholarship applications, Course Registration, etc.

- Can register for the following types of courses:

- Language Education courses and Common Liberal Arts courses can be registered by students from either college. The number of students and classes will be arranged based on the number of students in each college.
- The start date and time of registration differs by college.
- Students can register for major education courses in other colleges (APM) starting in course registration B period of their 2nd year (3rd semester).

2. GPA Priority Registration – From 2nd Semester

The start time of Registration Period A depends on your GPA.






