APS: How to Check Credits Required for Graduation

- You must meet the credit requirements under “Required (adjusted)”, as shown in the red square, in order to graduate**

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APS Graduation Requirements

APS Graduation Requirements

- To graduate, students must meet the following requirements:

No.	Requirements
1	Enroll for at least four years
2	Complete at least 124 credits total
3	Complete required language subjects (or be exempted from required language subjects)
4	Fulfill the credit requirements for each subject field
5	Complete at least 20 credits of subjects held in English (This requirement applies only to Japanese-basis domestic students)
6	Choose and register an Area of Study
7	Complete at least 2 credits from the required subjects for your registered Area of Study (Common Liberal Arts Subjects)
8	Complete at least 28 credits from the Major Education Subjects for your registered Area of Study

Requirement 3: Complete required language subjects (or be exempted from required language subjects)

► **English-basis students must take Japanese language courses!**

- The starting level of Japanese language courses will be based on the results of the placement test at the time of enrollment.
- Until all required Japanese courses are completed, the University will continue to automatically register and assign students to classes.

- Students must earn 124 credits to graduate, but the total number of required credits for all specified fields is 102 (see blue box).
 - The remaining 22 credits do not need to be taken in a specific subject field. Please earn these credits in the fields you are interested in.
- 124 Credits – 102 Credits = 22 Credits

Remaining 22 credits can be from any subject field


- Depending on your starting level for Japanese, the number of required credits for “Japanese Language Subjects” and “Language Education and Common Liberal Arts Subjects” will change slightly, but all students are still required to earn a total of 102 credits within these specified subject fields.
