Purport

Article 1

These College Regulations stipulate subjects, required credits for graduation, and other curricular matters pertaining to the College of Asia Pacific Studies, in accordance with Article 15, Paragraph 3 of the Ritsumeikan Asia Pacific University University Regulations.

English Notation

Article 2

English notation for the college, department, and program shall be as follows:

- 1) アジア太平洋学部 College of Asia Pacific Studies
- 2) アジア太平洋学科 Department of Asia Pacific Studies
- 3) 学士課程 Undergraduate Program

Purpose of Education and Research

Article 3

The College of Asia Pacific Studies, drawing on the paradigm shift of the 21st century's turbulent global society, aims to promote a comprehensive understanding of the diverse societies, political conditions, economies, cultures and their uniqueness in the Asia Pacific region, and will provide an educational environment that enables the acquisition of problem-solving and practical skills based on foundational and specialized knowledge in the social sciences to solve the diverse problems the Asia-Pacific region faces. At the same time, we aim to nurture students trained with expertise, empathy, communication skills, and integrity (noble-minded and strength of core) to contribute to the sustainable development and coexistence in the region.

Curriculum Policy

Article 4

Subjects in the College of Asia Pacific Studies consist of Common Education Subjects and Major Education Subjects offered over the course of four years.

- 2 Common Education Subjects are subdivided into Language Education Subjects and Common Liberal Arts Subjects. Language Education Subjects are further subdivided into English Subjects, Japanese Subjects, AP Language Subjects, Specific Subjects, and Common Language Subjects.

Common Liberal Arts Subjects are further subdivided into APU Literacy Subjects, Introduction to Major Studies Subjects, Global Citizens Foundation Subjects, and Common Subjects.

3 Major Education Subjects are subdivided into Core Subjects, Seminar Subjects, APS Common Subjects A, APS Common Subjects B, and Area of Study Subjects. Area of Study Subjects are further subdivided into International Relations, Culture, Society and Media, and Global Economy Subjects.

Subjects

Article 5

Subject Names, Number of Credits, Methods of Instruction, Subject Type

(Required/Elective/Optional), and the Semester Available From are as follows:

- 1) Common Education Subjects—Language Education Subjects: Table 1 (1) [1]
- 2) Common Education Subjects—Common Liberal Arts Subjects: Table 1 (1) [2]
- 3) Major Education Subjects: Table 1 (2)

Subjects That May Be Taken More Than Once

Article 5-2

Subjects that are identical to other subjects for which credits have already been earned may not be repeated.

2 Notwithstanding the preceding paragraph, subjects listed in the Tables below may be taken more than once, even if they have the same subject name, provided that they have different themes.

However, the number of credits which can be included in the number required for graduation are limited to the number that would be obtained from taking the subject only once, no matter how many times it is taken.

- 1) Major Seminar

Required Credits for Graduation

Article 6

The minimum number of credits required for graduation is 124, including credits from subjects designated as “Required” under Subject Type (Required/Elective/Optional) in Table 1 below.

However, credits from Optional Subjects cannot be included in the minimum.

- 2 Students must complete at least 40 credits of Common Education Subjects, including at least 16 credits of Common Liberal Arts Subjects.
- 3 Students must complete at least 62 credits of Major Education Subjects.
- 4 Students must select one Area of Study (i.e. International Relations; Culture, Society and Media; Global Economy) and complete at least 36 credits of that Area of Study’s Subjects which are also

Major Education Subjects. In addition, students must complete at least 2 credits from the subjects listed below for each Area of Study.

1) International Relations: “Introduction to International Relations” or “Introduction to Comparative Politics.”

2) Culture, Society and Media: “Introduction to Culture and Society” or “Introduction to Media Studies.”

3) Global Economy: “Introduction to Economics” or “World Economy and Global Issues.”

5 Seminar subjects and APS Common Subjects B can be included in the 36 required credits of Area of Study Subjects stipulated in the preceding paragraph.

6 Enrollment in Language Education Subjects which are also Common Education Subjects shall be as follows:

1) Japanese-basis Standard Track: English Standard Track subjects listed in Table 1 (1) [1]

2) Japanese-basis Advanced Track: English Advanced Track subjects listed in Table 1 (1) [1]

3) English-basis: Japanese subjects listed in Table 1 (1) [1]

7 Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding paragraph, students who have satisfied the criteria by taking a prescribed examination may take other Common Education Subjects in lieu of subjects designated as “Required” under Subject Type (Required/Elective/Optional) in Table 1.

8 Students falling under Paragraph 6, Items 1 or 2 whose residential status in Japan is not “student” as stipulated by the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act must complete a combined 20 credits or more of Common Liberal Arts Subjects and Major Education Subjects in English.

9 Notwithstanding the provisions of Paragraph 1, up to 22 credits earned from Major Education Subjects taken in the other Colleges can be included in the credits required for graduation.

Methods for Taking Subjects

Article 6-2

Students must take the Common Liberal Arts Subjects within Common Education Subjects and Seminar Subjects within Major Education Subjects stipulated in Table 3. However, this does not apply to 2nd year transfer students and 3rd year transfer students.

2 Subjects requiring the acquisition of credits from other subjects as a requirement for registration are listed in Table 4 (1)

3 Subjects requiring the lack of acquisition of credits from other subjects as a requirement for registration are listed in Table 4 (2)

4 Notwithstanding the provisions of Paragraph 1, students may be exempted from taking Major Seminar listed in Table 3 with the approval of the Faculty Council in the following cases:

1) Students who study abroad or take Advanced Area Studies during the spring semester of their third year.

2) Students who study abroad or take Advanced Area Studies during the fall semester of their third year.

Curriculum Applicability

Article 6-3

The subject type, number of credits, course completion method, number of credits required for graduation, credit assessment, etc. (hereinafter referred to as [curriculum]) applicable to the student at the moment of enrollment, will remain the same until graduation.

2 The curriculum assigned a transfer student or a readmitted student will be that of other students in the same semester.

3 The curriculum assigned to students transferring colleges within the university will be that of other students in the same semester.

Regulations for Amendments and Deletions

Article 7

Amendments and deletions to these Regulations shall be made by the University Senate upon deliberation by the Faculty Council.

Supplementary Provisions

(Date of Effect)

1 These College Regulations shall take effect on April 1, 2020.

2 Curriculum policy, subjects, and credits required for graduation stipulated in the Ritsumeikan Asia Pacific University Regulations enacted on April 26, 2019 will apply to students enrolled prior to AY 2020, regardless of those stipulated in Article 4 through Article 6 and the Tables below.

Supplementary Provisions (March 7, 2023 Partial revisions in accordance with curriculum reforms)

1 These College Regulations shall take effect on April 1, 2023

2 Regardless of the preceding paragraph, the preceding provisions will still apply to students enrolled on March 31st, 2023.

3 Regardless of paragraph 1, the preceding provisions will still apply to students transferred in their 2nd year or higher by AY2023, or transferred in 3rd year or higher by AY2024.

Supplementary Provisions (February 6, 2024 Partial revision in accordance with specification of method for taking courses and clarification of added provisions regarding curriculum applicability)

- 1 These regulations will take effect from February 6, 2024; and shall apply retroactively from April 1, 2023.
- 2 Regardless of the provision above, for students enrolled by March 31 2023, the stipulated in the preceding shall remain applicable.
- 3 Regardless of Paragraph 1, the amended Article 5 Table 1 and Article 6-3, shall apply from April 1, 2024. However, the amended Article 6-3 Paragraph 2 and Paragraph 3, shall be applicable from April 1, 2026 onwards, to those students enrolled by March 31, 2024.
- 4 Notwithstanding Paragraph 2, in regards to students enrolling on and after April 1, 2017 and students enrolled by March 31, 2023, to the previous “Article 5 Table 1 (1) [1]—Common Education Subjects, Language Education Subjects” and “Article 15-2 Table 1 (1) [1]—Common Education Subjects, Language Education Subjects” of the Ritsumeikan Asia Pacific University University Regulations taking effect on April 26, 2019, the following added subjects will be applicable.

- 1 These College Regulations shall take effect on April 1, 2025
- 2 Regardless of the provision above, for students enrolled by March 31 2023, the stipulated in the preceding shall remain applicable.
- 3 Regardless of the preceding paragraph, the amended Article 5 Table 1 and Article 6-2 Item 4 shall apply to those students enrolled from April 1 2023 onwards and are enrolled as of March 31 2025.
