Regulation No. 1215

Purport

Article 1

These College Regulations stipulate subjects, required credits for graduation, and other curricular matters pertaining to the College of Sustainability and Tourism, in accordance with Article 15, Paragraph 3 of the Ritsumeikan Asia Pacific University University Regulations.

English Notation

Article 2

English notation for the college, department, and program shall be as follows:

- 1) サステイナビリティ観光学部 College of Sustainability and Tourism
- 2) サステイナビリティ観光学科 Department of Sustainability and Tourism
- 3) 学士課程 Undergraduate Program

Purpose of Education and Research

Article 3

The purpose of the College of Sustainability and Tourism is to develop human resources who can cope with various challenges and act responsibly as global citizens by gaining a cross-disciplinary understanding of society and regions, acquiring basic and specialized knowledge on the creation of sustainable society and tourism, and learning logical and critical thinking, qualitative and quantitative analysis, problem solving, and communication and collaboration in a cross-cultural environment through a curriculum based on sociology in collaboration with various social actors both on and off campus.

Curriculum Policy

Article 4

Subjects in the College of Sustainability and Tourism consist of Common Education Subjects and Major Education Subjects offered over the course of four years.

2 Common Education Subjects are subdivided into Language Education Subjects and Common Liberal Arts Subjects. Language Education Subjects are further subdivided into English Subjects, Japanese Subjects, AP Language Subjects, Specific Subjects, and Common Language Subjects. Common Liberal Arts Subjects are further subdivided into APU Literacy Subjects, Introduction to Major Studies Subjects, Global Citizens Foundation

Subjects, and Common Subjects.

3 Major Education Subjects are subdivided into Tourism Subjects, Sustainable Society Subjects, ST Common

Subjects, Academic Skills Subjects, Off-Campus Program Subjects, and Seminar/Final Results Subjects.

Subjects

Article 5

Subject Names, Number of Credits, Methods of Instruction, Subject Type (Required/Elective/Optional), and the Semester Available From are as follows:

1) Common Education Subjects—Language Education Subjects: Table 1 (1) [1]

2) Common Education Subjects—Common Liberal Arts Subjects: Table 1 (1) [2]

3) Major Education Subjects: Table 1 (2)

Subjects That May Be Taken More Than Once

Article 5-2

Subjects that are identical to other subjects for which credits have already been earned may not be repeated.

2 Notwithstanding the preceding paragraph, subjects listed in the Tables below may be taken more than once, even if they have the same subject name, provided that they have different themes. However, the number of credits which can be included in the number required for graduation are limited to the number that would be obtained from taking the subject only once, no matter how many times it is taken.

1) Practicum: 4 credits

2) Specialized Internship: 8 credits

Required Credits for Graduation

Article 6

The minimum number of credits required for graduation is 124, including credits from subjects designated as "Required" under Subject Type (Required/Elective/Optional) in Table 1 below.

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2 Students must complete at least 40 credits of Common Education Subjects, including at least 16 credits of Common Liberal Arts Subjects.

3 Students must complete at least 62 credits of Major Education Subjects, including the following:

1) Students must complete at least 10 credits of Tourism Subjects.

2) Students must complete at least 10 credits of Sustainable Society Subjects.

3) Students must complete at least 2 credits of Off-Campus Program Subjects (Practicums, Field Studies, or Specialized Internships).

4) Students must complete at least 2 credits of Final Results Subjects (Graduation Project or Capstone).

4 Enrollment in Language Education Subjects which are also Common Education Subjects shall be as

follows:

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- 1) Japanese-basis Standard Track: English Standard Track subjects listed in Table 1 (1) [1]
- 2) Japanese-basis Advanced Track: English Advanced Track subjects listed in Table 1 (1) [1]
- 3) English-basis: Japanese subjects listed in Table 1 (1) [1]
- 5 Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding paragraph, students who have satisfied the criteria by taking a prescribed examination may take other Common Education Subjects in lieu of subjects designated as "Required" under Subject Type (Required/Elective/Optional) in Table 1
- 6 Students falling under Paragraph 4, Items 1 or 2 whose residential status in Japan is not "student" as stipulated by the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act must complete a combined 20 credits or more of Common Liberal Arts Subjects and Major Education Subjects in English.
- 7 Notwithstanding the provisions of Paragraph 1, up to 22 credits earned from Major Education Subjects taken in the other Colleges can be included in the credits required for graduation.

Methods for Taking Subjects

Article 6-2

Students must take the Common Liberal Arts Subjects within Common Education Subjects and Seminar Subjects within Major Education Subjects specified in Table 3. However, 2nd and 3rd year transfer students will not be required to take "Student Success Workshop" and "Multicultural Cooperative Workshop."

- 2 Subjects requiring the acquisition of credits from other subjects as a requirement for registration are listed in Table 4 (1).
- 3 Subjects requiring the lack of acquisition of credits from other subjects as a requirement for registration are listed in Table 4 (2).
- 4 Notwithstanding the provisions of Paragraph 1, the exceptions listed below may apply if prior approval is granted during a Faculty Council Meeting.
- (1) Students studying abroad in the spring semester of their 3rd year are not required to take "Major Seminar."
- (2) Students studying abroad in the fall semester of their 3rd year are not required to take "Major Seminar."
- (3) Students are not required to take "Practicum" if they fall under the special enrollment provision as stipulated in Article 61 of the Ritsumeikan Asia Pacific University Academic Affairs Regulations.

Curriculum Applicability

Article 6-3

The subject type, number of credits, course completion method, number of credits required for graduation, credit assessment, etc. (hereinafter referred to as "curriculum") applicable to a student applicable to the student at the moment of enrollment, will remain the same until graduation.

- 2 The curriculum assigned to a transfer student or a readmitted student will be that of other students in the same semester.
- 3 The curriculum assigned to students transferring colleges within the university will be that of other students in the same semester.

Regulations for Amendments and Deletions

Article 7

Amendments and deletions to these Regulations shall be made by the University Senate upon deliberation by the Faculty Council

Supplementary Provisions

(Date of Effect)

These College Regulations shall take effect on April 1, 2023.

Supplementary Provisions (February 6, 2024: Partial revisions for clarification, including specifying the course completion method and adding a provision about curriculum applicability)

- 1 These College Regulations shall take effect on February 6, 2024, and apply retroactively form April 1, 2023
- 2 Notwithstanding the preceding paragraph, Article 6-3 as amended shall apply from April 1, 2024. However, paragraphs 2 and 3 of Article 6-3 as amended shall apply from April 1, 2026 for those enrolled after March 31, 2024.

Supplementary Provisions (April 8, 2025: partial revisions in accordance with the addition of provisions for subjects that may be taken more than once and additions and changes to courses and fields.)

These College Regulations shall take effect on April 1, 2025.
