For “Of which are Repeaters (B)” and “Of which are Withdrawals (C),” enter the number of students whose advancement was delayed or who withdrew between May 1 (in the case of a university with a fall admissions program, the date on which the “Number of Students Enrolled” is confirmed after the fall semester has started) of the applicable academic year and the end of the academic year. If there have been students whose advancement was delayed or who withdrew between April 1 and this period, enter the number in the Remarks field.
  - For “Of which Repeaters (B)” do not include students planning to take subjects over an extended period, students on a leave of absence, students whose advancement was delayed due to a leave of absence, students away on study abroad programs, or students whose advancement was delayed due to study abroad.
  - For “Of which Withdrawals (C)” include students who were expelled.
  - For those classified as Repeaters that withdraw during their repeating year, only include them in “Of which are Withdrawals (C),” and not “Of which are Repeaters (B).”
