



Overview	Academic Advising offers support for students to help them identify their personal and academic goals and achieve those goals. Individual advising is arranged through a pre-reservation system and held with faculty advisors for 45 minutes per individual. Sessions on stress management and time management targeted towards groups are planned 1~2 times per semester.	The Writing Center aims to provide support to improve academic writing skills in both English and Japanese, and develop "independent writers," writers who can independently identify and correct issues within their own writing.	The AMC supports students who are taking one of the four subjects of Fundamental Mathematics, Business Mathematics, Advanced Mathematics, and Statistics, and helps these students find their "ability to solve problems on their own" through one-on-one individual guidance with trained undergraduate student tutors.	The SALC aims to help students become autonomous language learners and confident language users who envision their own goals and continue to grow as lifelong learners. In the PA sessions, student peer advisors offer individual consultations in a variety of languages.	The SALC aims to help students become autonomous language learners and confident language users who envision their own goals and continue to grow as lifelong learners. In LA sessions, English language faculty work as language advisors and offer various consultations for individuals for English language study.	ALRCS is a group of student staff who aim to revitalize student study support and use of the Learning Commons. ALRCS supports students in how to use the Library and basic computer operation. ALRCS also promotes the use of the Library.	The student exchange program requires students to not only have a high level of English proficiency but also a solid study plan. At APU, SEAs support students who aspire to participate in a student exchange program. SEA is an organization comprised of senior students who have experienced student exchange and provide positive support based on their own experiences, through consultations about how to partake in a student exchange, how to make a study plans to achieve those goals, life overseas, and career pathways following the student exchange program.
