

WARABESHU was formed in June 2007 by four members based in jyoyo-machi, Yame City.

About Kurogi Castle Town

Located in the eastern part of the Kurogi Basin in southern Fukuoka Prefecture, this castle town developed at the confluence of the Kasahara River and the upper reaches of the Yabe River, with the medieval Nekojo (Kurogi Castle) as its main castle.Kurogi-machi, which is no longer a castle town, developed as a zaikyoumachi and was a gathering place for Okuyame's products. It is the fourth district in the prefecture and the 85th in Japan to be selected as a national Important Preservation District for Groups of Traditional Buildings.

You will be divided into two groups for a walk around the historic castle town, including a tour of soy sauce production, a visit to a sake brewery, and a street with carp swimming in the water.

At the rest stop, enjoy freshly pounded rice cakes and Yamecha made during the rice cake pounding experience.)
